#### Why Pledge?

Did you know that UU fellowships are run as independent democratic organizations? Many of you have participated in the Yearly Meetings or as Board members or members of other committees. Perhaps you have voted for Board members or on issues that arise from time to time. AUUF is a very participatory individual entity, raising its own money to keep itself afloat This is different from other churches I've been part of where a lot of the income comes from Conference or Synod.

You may have an idea of how AUUF's budget is generated. Each year the Finance Committee and the Board are tasked with tallying the known costs for the following fiscal year, including salaries for paid employees, building expenses, etc. They then set a fundraising goal, and it's the Stewardship Committee's task to collect (hopefully) enough pledges to cover the lion's share of those costs. The rest is raised through building rentals, fundraising events and such, throughout the year, along with whatever is put into the basket each Sunday or donated online. As with anyone's budget, it's much easier to plan if the income is known, and not random!

Too often the motivation for the Fellowship making an annual payment to the Municipality of Anchorage in lieu of property taxes is seen as a very ordinary one: the obligation to pay for street and sidewalk maintenance, fire fighting and law enforcement, services we need for our building and grounds. Yet, there is a higher purpose in line with our principles. Only the municipality has the resources and authority to truly tackle the problem of homelessness as a community-wide issue. Only the municipality through its ordinances can ensure equal rights for all regardless of race, color, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, religion, national origin, marital status, age, or physical or mental disability. Only the municipality advances learning through a network of public libraries to serve neighborhoods throughout our community. PILOT shows that we support what advances our own principles. When we make our collections this month at our Sunday services, half our contributions will go to the Municipality of Anchorage. #### Stewardship Message from Board Member,

#### Mara Hill

I have never been able to call myself a particularly lavish pledger. I started attending AUUF 20 years ago, when I was a freshman in high school, and it may not surprise you to learn that my YRUU group wasn't discussing the budget. Adults were doing that to make sure I had opportunities to earn money in exchange for providing childcare, to take OWL classes, and to learn from Doug Eby that the Council of Nicaea occurred in 325 A.D. (I did just Google that fact to confirm it, and am thrilled to tell you my memory was correct). When I came back to Anchorage and AUUF after college, I contributed my time in RE, OWL, and other various volunteer roles while pledging a few dollars a month. We talk about time, talent, and treasure as three means of contributing to AUUF, and for a long while I emphasized giving what I had: my time. But things changed. I took a break from volunteer roles after completing a couple long and taxing commitments. My job got more stressful, and I didn't have the bandwidth to take on more responsibility outside of work. I got married. I had a baby. In short: I stopped giving my time. And, until Doug "Council of Nicaea" Eby invited me to fill an open spot on the Board and I started discussing the budget in a big way, it hadn't really dawned on me that for the last few years, I hadn't contributed much time, talent, or treasure to a place that's always contributed a lot to me.

There has been a lot of focus on the budget lately, with good reason! Here are some facts about our current situation, courtesy of Doug Eby (a recurring theme in my AUUF life): Over the past few years we have upgraded our pay and benefits for paid positions. We currently have a full time minister and RE director, about half time Administrator and Communications positions, and part time or contracted Music Director, AV Coordinator, and Janitor. The good news is all of these positions are filled, and those eligible will be receiving retirement contributions. This is incredible, and deserves to be celebrated! But, as you may have guessed: this does cost more money than our recurring budget adds up to. The past two years we have filled our "gap," which has totaled \$33,000, with one-time Undesignated Reserves. However, during the past three years we have had some vacancies and have not ended up spending any of this one-time money, allowing us to do the same thing again the following year – for several years.


This year's gap is bigger: If we continue to generate the same in pledges and non-pledge revenue as we are currently generating during the coming year, we'll be short \$60,000.

We have a number of options to try to address this gap. We can use one-time Undesignated Reserves; we can all choose to pledge more; we can encourage more people to join our organization; we can generate increased revenue from leasing our facility more frequently and facilitate more revenue-generating activities; we can plan on a combination of all of the above.

However, we have not made progress on closing this gap in the past three years despite having planned to do so. So, we in leadership are asking everyone to re-evaluate whether you are able to give more. I hadn't looked at my pledge in years, and realized that while I've started to give some of my time again, I'm also in a position to give more treasure. While I still wouldn't call my pledging lavish, this year I found that I was comfortably able to double my pledge.

We also want to recognize, and celebrate, the fact that AUUF is in the upper half of UU congregations in terms of per person pledging/giving my members, and we don't want to push too hard. We hope you'll consider other actions as well - reaching out to people who you think would enjoy being part of AUUF, or becoming an activist to take on making more money through activities people pay for. And, we are open to any and all other new ideas!

So: let's celebrate all that we are doing, our robust staffing achievement, and our generous giving – while continuing to look for ways to close our gap!

Cari here — I couldn't find any better words to say what Marie wrote last year... The same issue is with us again. We're about \$30,000 short of our goal. Please read the following, and consider very carefully how you could help AUUF meet its budget. It truly takes all of us!

Ten (actually, four!) days from now, February 18 (23), our pledge drive will officially end—only it won't, really. If you've forgotten to send in your pledge, you will hear from us this week and next by phone, email, or in person to remind you that AUUF needs your money to stay operating. 




