





### DO YOU WANT TO FOLLOW UP WITH SISTER HELEN PREJEAN READING AND THINKING ABOUT A PERSONAL JOURNEY TO SOCIAL ACTIVISM?

When anti-death penalty activist and author Sister Helen Prejean spoke to the Forum in

December, she generously offered to "come back" again for a session with people interested in reading her new book, "River of Fire: My Spiritual Journey." It is about her path to activism, and for those of you who are interested in personally journaling about your thoughts and reactions as you read it, Sr. Helen will spend some additional time with us to facilitate this process—a half hour introductory session to kick off the process, and another hour to wrap it up, both on Zoom through AUUF. The exact dates haven't been set yet, but we are looking at doing the initial session with her probably in mid-February, and the final session three to four weeks later.

This timing should allow people to do two things you will need to do to prepare: 1) Get a copy of the book, *River of Fire*, and 2) read the book or watch the movie *Dead Man Walking*, or one other film related to the start of her personal journey, that Sr. Helen has suggested we do before our introductory encounter with her. You can find the specifics in a set of notes Sister Helen has sent us that describes what she has in mind, with some suggestions about reading and journaling, that you can find here.

Some will want to do this as an individual, personal exercise, others may want to form or join a small group to share the experience between the opening and closing sessions with Sr. Helen. That is entirely up to you. We will plan to keep you posted of more detailed information about this in announcements in Today at Your Fellowship and at the Forum in the coming weeks.

## Freethinkers Noon Friday January 29

A Promised Land opens with President Barack Hussein Obama II's unique childhood and concludes in the aftermath of our Nation's Seal Team Six raid on a compound in Abbottabad in May 2011. Sweeping us along on his journey, Obama's lifetime of journaling allows him to write with exacting detail, clarity, candor, humility, and humor about the unique arc of his life that took him to the most powerful position in the land - a position where the opposition conspired to thwart his every initiative.

Freethinkers are reading to the end of volume one of this mesmerizing memoir this week as our Nation confronts the reality of a fractured republic hoping to restore its promise. In his *Preface*, the President writes,

We will learn to live together, cooperate with one another, and recognize the dignity of others, or we will perish. And so the world watches America—the only great power in history made up of people from every corner of the planet, comprising every race and faith and cultural practice—to see if our experiment in democracy can work. 

## Native Peoples Action 2 hrs - 🛞

The Alaska Legislature gaveled in recently and one of the bills up for consideration is Senate Bill 39. This bill is a voter suppression bill, meaning it will make it harder to vote in Alaska. We already face voting barriers in Alaska, specifically in Tribal communities where location can make it already difficult to vote. This bill also repeals vote-by-mail for certain elections and would criminalize being a neighbor and helping our friends and family to submit their ballots.

It has been a tough year. We're coming up on the anniversary of being socially distant from all of our loved ones, not being able to visit family during holidays and other important events such as weddings and memorials. We've been homeschooling, juggling work and caregiving for others in ways we might never have imagined. The scaffolding of regular events that supported our lives has been completely set aside. Underneath all of us this is the concern we all have of getting sick or someone close to us getting sick. It's a lot to continually cope with.

Now imagine having to face all this without one's regular financial security.

I have friends and family members that have been scrambling to keep food in the refrigerator and their rent paid. Saying it has been difficult is an understatement. And, it's nothing to be ashamed of. These are extraordinary times. I know we keep saying that, and it keeps being true.

Fortunately, at AUUF we have some regular mechanisms for collecting funds for those who might need some help. At the moment we have over \$6000 in the MInister's Caring Fund. I fear that people haven't been asking me about help because they're embarrassed or they think someone else might need it. Please don't be embarrassed. Please ask. Caring for each other is one of the many reasons we come together as a community.

If it makes any difference, I too, have been in places in my life where I needed some financial help and family and friends stepped up to help out so we could pay some unexpected bills or to help with a few extras that made life a little more enjoyable. Some of those friends were members of my congregation before I was a minister--I'm so grateful for their support. And now, I try to pay it forward when I can.

We all need help, in many ways, at different times in our lives. If right now your finances are causing extra stress on top of everything else we're experiencing, please let me know. Your congregation has provided a way to help for just these circumstances. Please be in touch.
