Invitation from the Welcoming Congregation Action Team

The Welcoming Congregation Action Team is working toward the yearly renewal of our fellowship as a Welcoming Congregation for the LGBTQ+ community. As part of the renewal, we will be offering a course called Transgender Inclusion in Congregations that was developed by the Transforming Hearts Collective. We hope you'll join us! Here is a short description of the course from the Collective's website:

This course is for individuals, groups, and congregational teams who want to take their knowledge and skills to the next level in terms of trans identity and how to create congregations that are fully inclusive and affirming of the full breadth of gender diversity. Over six sessions you will deeply explore the intersection of trans identity, spirituality, and faith community, and gain the grounding, context, and skills to transform yourself and your congregation.

Each of the six sessions includes a one-hour presentation by UU Rev. Mykal Slack followed by an hour of discussion. While we encourage you to attend all the sessions, you can attend only those that work for your schedule and interest. Please use the following

I like to remind myself of that mission before every board meeting.

I have attended and volunteered at the Fellowship since 1991. In 2022, there seemed to be a real slump in our attendance and volunteer base due to the pandemic. **January HALF PORTION FOR SOCIAL ACTION:
Alaska Institute for Justice**

The Alaska Institute for Justice (AIJ) is the January Half Portion donation recipient. AIJ was founded in 2005 as the Alaska Immigration Justice Project with the mission to protect the Human Rights of Alaskans. Today, AIJ comprises three programs that together help break down barriers to access to social, health, and legal services, champion critical policy changes for indigenous communities and promote justice for all. AIJ's programs include the Alaska Immigration Justice Project (AIJP), the Language Interpreter Center, and the Climate Justice Program.

All three programs are of the utmost importance to AIJ's mission and the diverse populations AIJ serves. However, the Alaska Immigration Justice Project is AIJ's longest standing program, with a long history of serving immigrant communities and protecting human trafficking victims, many of whom have also experienced domestic violence and sexual assault. The Victims of Trafficking and Violence Protection Act was enacted in October 2000. As defined by this law, victims of human trafficking can be divided into three populations:

- Children under age 18 induced into commercial sex
- Adults aged 18 or over induced into commercial sex through force, fraud, or coercion
- Children and adults induced to perform labor or services through force, fraud, or coercion

The first federal prosecution to occur in the United States after this legislation was enacted occurred in Anchorage, Alaska. AIJ staff worked with the FBI, US Attorney's Office and the legacy Immigration and Naturalization Service to ensure that the 7 victims received access to safety and protection. As the Nation faces uncertainty on many fronts with the upcoming change of Presidential Administration, the Alaska Immigration Justice Project's services are more critical than ever to help protect and guide Alaskans facing complex immigration, asylum, and refugee processes. AIJP currently represents approximately 310 clients and continues to prioritize representation of immigrants fleeing persecution, torture, human trafficking, sexual assault and domestic violence.

January HALF PORTION FOR SOCIAL ACTION: Alaska Institute for Justice

The Alaska Institute for Justice (AIJ) is the January Half Portion donation recipient. AIJ was founded in 2005 as the Alaska Immigration Justice Project with the mission to protect the Human Rights of Alaskans. Today, AIJ comprises three programs that together help break down barriers to access to social, health, and legal services, champion critical policy changes for indigenous communities and promote justice for all. AIJ's programs include the Alaska Immigration Justice Project (AIJP), the Language Interpreter Center, and the Climate Justice Program.

All three programs are of the utmost importance to AIJ's mission and the diverse populations AIJ serves. However, the Alaska Immigration Justice Project is AIJ's longest standing program, with a long history of serving immigrant communities and

protecting human trafficking victims, many of whom have also experienced domestic violence and sexual assault. The Victims of Trafficking and Violence Protection Act was enacted in October 2000. As defined by this law, victims of human trafficking can be divided into three populations:

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The first federal prosecution to occur in the United States after this legislation was enacted occurred in Anchorage, Alaska. AIJ staff worked with the FBI, US Attorney's Office and the legacy Immigration and Naturalization Service to ensure that the 7 victims received access to safety and protection. As the Nation faces uncertainty on many fronts with the upcoming change of Presidential Administration, the Alaska Immigration Justice Project's services are more critical than ever to help protect and guide Alaskans facing complex immigration, asylum, and refugee processes. AIJP currently represents approximately 310 clients and continues to prioritize representation of immigrants fleeing persecution, torture, human trafficking, sexual assault and domestic violence.

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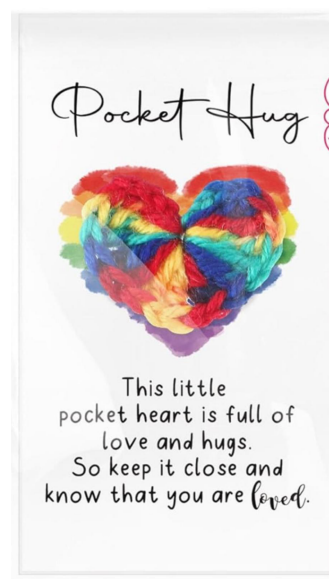
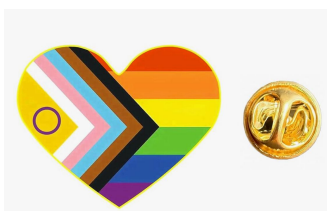

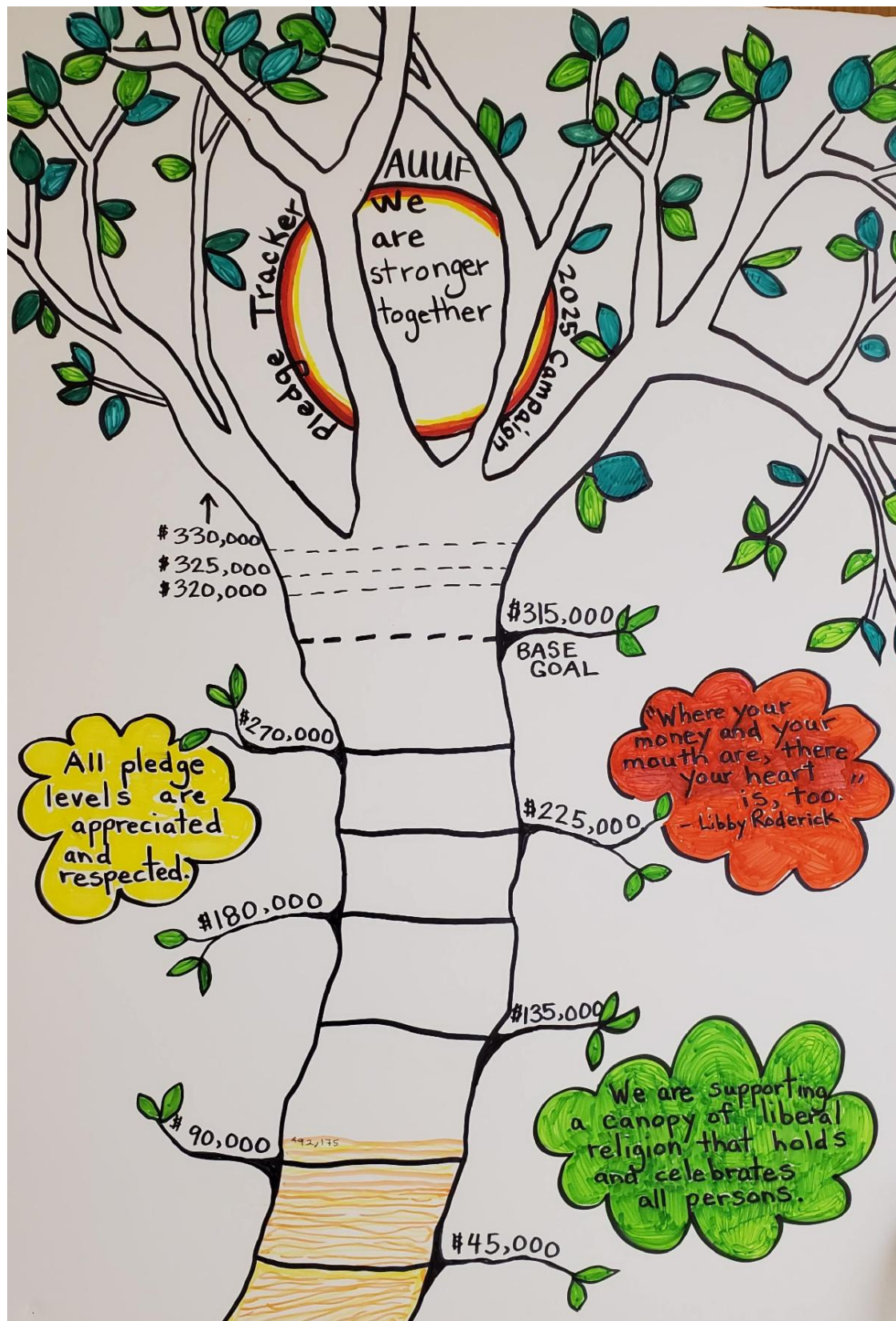
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Pledging Basics
