





Whale Coast Alaska 2021

Whale Coast has been a big fundraiser for AUUF for many years. Our members host the tourists in our homes providing bed and breakfast with Alaskan hospitality. AUUF usually provides meeting space for the group for the few days they are here and hosts a dinner. The tour pays our fellowship about \$85 per person per night instead of paying hotels. We get to meet some very nice UU travelers and show off a bit of our state for them sometimes.

Whale Coast tours were cancelled in 2020 but Dave Frey, tour organizer from Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Fairbanks, is pulling together June and July tours this year. AUUF will be supporting him by providing hosts and some transportation services this year. Beloved Conversations for UU the Vote is an intentional cohort of Beloved Conversations participants that is designed to grow our capacity to build justice focused leadership teams that are rooted in anti-racist praxis. There are no shortcuts to justice or transformation. Anti-racism is a constant practice of learning, unlearning, reflection and action. Folks from a range of experience and who work on a range of issues are encouraged to join.

Beloved Conversations—a faith formation anti-racism program through our Unitarian Universalist seminary in Chicago, Meadville Lombard Theological School—went virtual last fall and over 1,200 learners joined the first 'Within' phase. This program is an experience of connection and spiritual development that you don't want to miss.

The Spring Term registration opens February 1st and closes on February 26th. The Spring Term begins March 16th, with lessons published every two weeks, as well as biweekly small group check-ins with your own UUtheVote "pod" and monthly large group worship and discussion. In the program's current phase, 'Within,' we engage with a personal exploration of race and our work for racial justice. With two caucuses, our white participants are invited into the Un/learning for Liberation course and our BIPOC+ participants are invited into the Gathering Ourselves course. In Beloved Conversations, we are here to heal the impact of racism on our lives. Let's get free together.

It has been a tough year. We're coming up on the anniversary of being socially distant from all of our loved ones, not being able to visit family during holidays and other important events such as weddings and memorials. We've been homeschooling, juggling work and caregiving for others in ways we might never have imagined. The scaffolding of regular events that supported our lives

has been completely set aside. Underneath all of us this is the concern we all have of getting sick or someone close to us getting sick. It's a lot to continually cope with.

Now imagine having to face all this without one's regular financial security.

I have friends and family members that have been scrambling to keep food in the refrigerator and their rent paid. Saying it has been difficult is an understatement. And, it's nothing to be ashamed of. These are extraordinary times. I know we keep saying that, and it keeps being true.

Fortunately, at AUUF we have some regular mechanisms for collecting funds for those who might need some help. At the moment we have over \$6000 in the MInister's Caring Fund. I fear that people haven't been asking me about help because they're embarrassed or they think someone else might need it. Please don't be embarrassed. Please ask. Caring for each other is one of the many reasons we come together as a community.

If it makes any difference, I too, have been in places in my life where I needed some financial help and family and friends stepped up to help out so we could pay some unexpected bills or to help with a few extras that made life a little more enjoyable. Some of those friends were members of my congregation before I was a minister--I'm so grateful for their support. And now, I try to pay it forward when I can.

We all need help, in many ways, at different times in our lives. If right now your finances are causing extra stress on top of everything else we're experiencing, please let me know. Your congregation has provided a way to help for just these circumstances. Please be in touch.



As Marie says, "We are great bunny-trail/tangent followers, as evidenced in most of our sessions. And yet, eventually we get back to important mainstream ideas in the books we tackle. Today, QAnon and conspiracy theories as related to myth got a lot of verbal ink. "Myth" is a slippery term, worth a trip to a dictionary, online or print. I'm inclined to put the QAnon and related conspiracy stuff into the newer dictionary category of "urban myth," "a story about an unusual event or occurrence that many people believe is true but that is not true." A couple of days ago, I ran across a piece by Richard A. Friedman in *The New York Review of Books*, "Why Conspiracy Theories Are So Alluring," which relates to

some of what we talked about today.

As for our reading in Joseph Campbell's *The Hero With A Thousand Faces*, keep going into Chapter II, Initiation, sections 1-4, which takes you through the 4th section, "Atonement with the Father."

I keep reminding myself that this whole book is about a journey, which has certain important elements that the hero, male or female, must deal with in order to grow and progress. The zipping from Asia to Africa to the Middle East to Navajo beliefs shores up the ubiquity of the same basic human story—Frodo, Mrs Frisby, Luke Skywalker, Arthur, Marty McFly, Dorothy Gale., and a thousand other faces take that journey." 
